Conditions of Entry



Staff of the Discovery Centre may deny entry or remove a visitor from the premises at their discretion.



Visitors have a shared responsibility for their own safety and the safety of others. Visitors must:

- Take responsible care of their own health and safety
- Treat staff and other visitors with respect
- Take reasonable care to ensure they do not adversely affect the safety of others; and
- Comply with all instructions given by staff so far as they are reasonably able to.



Children under the age of 12 must be accompanied by an adult (over the age of 18) at all times.



Food and drink is not permitted in the Discovery Centre, including its gallery or theatrette.



Running skates, skateboards and heely shoes are not permitted in the Discovery Centre. Shoes must be worn at all times except on exhibits as signposted or instructed by staff.



Photographs and videos must not be taken of staff, visitors, or their children without their permission.



Objects which may pose a danger to others (umbrellas, camera tripods etc.) must be left at the entrance or other location as directed by staff.



The Discovery Centre and Lot Fourteen grounds are a designated non-smoking area in accordance with Commonwealth and Territory Legislation. Smoking and vaping is not permitted anywhere in the Discovery Centre or Lot Fourteen Grounds.



All visitors to the Discovery Centre are responsible for the safe keeping and security of their own personal belongings and valuables whilst on the premises. The Discovery Centre does not accept responsibility for the negligent acts or omissions of visitors. The Discovery Centre's liability to visitors is limited to loss and damage caused by a negligent act or omission by the Discovery Centre.




Surveillance cameras monitor and record the premises and exhibits at all times for the purposes of:

- Ensuring public safety.


